- 1- The course work shall be decided into six semesters with two papers in each semester.
- 2- Each paper in a semester will be of 75 marks out of which 60 marks for theory and 15 marks are allotted for internal assessment (written test or assignment or both).
- 3- Each theory paper consists of Section 'A' with maximum 15 marks (total 8 questions out of which any 5 questions have to be attempted with short answers, 3x5=15).
- 4- Section B with maximum 45 marks (total 6 questions out of which any 3 have to be attempted with long answers, 15x3=45)
- 5- Question paper shall cover the whole syllabus.
- 6- Practical exam in each semester will be of maximum 50 marks, out of which 12 marks are assigned for internal assessment (attendance, practical records ect.; 38 marks for practical examination & 12 marks for Internal Assessment).
- 7- Practical examination will be evaluated by both external and internal examiner.
- 8- The duration of theory and practical examination will be of 03 hours each.
