- SEC on Leadership in Democracy is designed in a way which appears to be more theoretical than skill-oriented. Further, the title of the course is Leadership in Democracy, therefore, the students who will opt for this course on the basis of the title of the course and stated outcomes would have the expectation to learn something about patterns of leadership in democracy and democratic leadership skills. But the course content includes only the concept of democracy and democratic institutions and there is no unit on leadership in the course, so there would be a gap in the expectations of the learners and the actual outcome of the course.
- Suggested Readings Section needs careful reading as there are some typos that should be rectified like जान सिंह सिंधु in place of ज्ञान सिंह सिंधु, विल किमतिका in place of विल किमलिका etc.

Suggested readings section also needs a little pruning. In a few courses, some books are suggested that do not match with the course content like Course:**DSE2 Foundations of Indian Political Thought**- In the content there is no Unit on Gandhi but in the Suggested readings many books on Gandhi are suggested like Iyer, R. (Ed.). (1997). *The collected works of Mahatma Gandhi* (Vols. 1–100). Iyer, R. (1973). *The moral and political thought of Mahatma Gandhi*. Gandhi, M. K. (1909). *Hind Swaraj or Indian home rule*. Similarly, in the suggested readings for the Course **Code: GE 3 Modern Indian Political Thought**, there are a number of books on Ancient Indian Political Thought. This has made the suggested reading sections quite repetitive.
